What Developers Started Doing

Bug fixing

Code cleaning

Faster start-up, less memory usage

New filters: Microsoft Visio, Corel Draw, WordPerfect, etc.

New features: SmartArt, improved interoperability

GNU-make completion & cross-compile for Windows

During-build unit tests & improved QA process

Moving bottom up ... clean code → clean UI → features

Polish ... making it usable and pretty: i.e. Ctrl-F to find

Improved QA (compared to OOo)

A real unit testing framework (to make sure we fix bugs only once!)

Compile time unit tests

Run a headless smoketest as a part of the build



Some Things Are Free

Your can use LibreOffice for free

You are free to distribute it

You are free to make changes to the product to fit your needs (bug fixes, new features, translations)

You have community support (documentation, forums, mailing lists, IRC)

Some Things Are Not Free

Professional L3 Support ("I want this bug fixed by Monday")

Customizations that don't provide any benefit to the whole community (LibreOffice with your icons, logo, etc.)

Professional Training

The Document Foundation does NOT provide those services directly, but some of his affiliates do. You are not locked to a single vendor.

Partners and affiliates (money or workforce)

Official certifications (technical and education). You don't need a certification to give support but it's a warranty that you are good at what you do.
